RESIDENTIAL TAXES - MIL RATE REDUCTION

Council has lowered the residential mil rate to 4.5 mils to reduce the burden on taxpayers in response to this year's significant increase in assessments by the Municipal Assessment agency. Municipal taxes for 2015 must now be paid in full. Outstanding balances are being prepared for credit recovery and will be submitted on January 8th 2016.

SNOW CLEARING

Council would like to remind residents once again this year that the snow clearing routes are done according to a priority list, which consists of bus routes first, and all other routes second. If the plow passes your road and does not clear it, please be assured it will return once the bus routes are completed. Council understands the frustration of travelling during snowy weather and we are working with our snow clearing operator to determine the best approach and timing for keeping the roads cleared while keeping costs down.

To aid in snow clearing operations, residents are advised to place highly visible markers on any items such as fences or garbage boxes located within the town's street reservation. Damage to any items not clearly marked will not be the responsibility of the Town's snow clearing operator (Harbour Construction) or the Town. Private plow operators and residents are not to push snow onto public roads or into public ditches, as this can cause issues with safety, visibility & flooding.



REMINDER: THE AVENUE IS A ONE-WAY STREET

A number of years ago, The Avenue was transformed into a fulltime one-way street with access only from Harbour Road. There is no access to The Avenue from the Southern Shore Highway at

any time – all buildings located on The Avenue (including the Knights of Columbus Building) are only accessible from The Avenue. St. Bernard's Elementary has recently contacted the Town voicing serious concerns about drivers continuing to travel the wrong way, posing a great danger to students, parents & staff. The Town has been working with the Province to improve signage at the upper intersection, and the RCMP have been asked to increase their presence in the area.

REGIONAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT PLAN: ADOPTED IN PRINCIPLE

The Town of Witless Bay has just become the first authority to adopt in principle the **Shamrock Shore Regional Emergency Management Plan**, which has been a number of years in the making. Once fully in force, this Plan will serve as an operational guide to prepare for, mitigate, prevent,









respond to and recover from potential threats, emergencies, or disasters for the Town of Witless Bay, the Town of Bay Bulls, and the Local Service Districts of Mobile, Tors Cove, and Burnt Cove – St. Michaels – Bauline East.

Town Infrastructure: A Quick Update

OUR PUFFIN CENTRE IS UP AND RUNNING!

The Puffin Centre, located on the South Side Track, is now officially opened and fully functional. We are currently taking bookings from community groups and individuals! Rental rates are \$100 for the first three hours (and \$50/hour thereafter), \$200 for a full evening rental (from 5pm to 8am the next morning), and \$300 for a full day (from 9am to 8am the following morning). Officially ratified groups and associations enjoy one free rental per week (for up to 3 hours), and rent the building for their regularly-scheduled weekly or monthly events at a 50% discount. *Please contact the Town Office at 334-3407 for more information.*

THE NEW SLIPWAY & PEERS

The Town of Witless Bay has been working in cooperation with the Federal Government's Small Crafts and Harbours division to acquire the Upper Pond site. The town is now the proud owner of a brand new concrete slipway! Over the coming year, we will work to further upgrade the site.

THE NEW FIRE DEPARTMENT & TOWN HALL

The Town of Witless Bay has now officially begun the process of moving the Fire Department into the former Municipal Garage by building an access to the Southern Shore Highway. Over the coming months, we will be preparing funding applications for the repurposing of both of our main buildings. Residents are invited to stop by the Town Office to see the preliminary designs. THE NEW BUILD-ON ON ST. BERNARD SCHOOL

Council approved the construction of two new modular classrooms for St. Bernard's Elementary School this past summer, for a renewable period of three years. We will continue lobbying the Province for the prompt construction of a Middle School for the area.

THE UPGRADING OF THE RECREATION GROUNDS

Council has submitted a grant application for the upgrading of the town's recreation grounds on the South Side Track. Working in conjunction with ACOA and the Bay Bulls to Bauline Athletic Association (BBBAA), we have developed a two-year plan involving new equipment, horseshoe pits, landscaped grounds, trees, upgraded parking lots, and creature comforts for the dog park.

THE SOUTH SIDE TRACK, PHASE II

The engineering work for the second phase of the South Side Track is now nearing completion, and the Town is preparing for the tendering process. The work is set to begin this Spring. Ninety percent of the project cost (\$770,000.00) has been secured through a grant from the Province.
